The Conference

The Canton of Grisons is famous for its cultural heritage, intact environment, strong tourism, and alpine climate. Yet, little is known about quantity and quality of the research carried out in the Canton and about the Canton. There is little public awareness, that significant, internationally recognized research is conducted by a significant number of research institutions and since more than 100 years. The outcome of these research efforts needs to be presented to the public and to political instances to demonstrate the socio-economic importance of scientific research and its contribution to the generation of new knowledge. The conference was initiated by Wissensstadt Davos and the first meeting held in Davos in August 2008 in collaboration with International Disaster and Risk Conference IDRC.

The Goals

This meeting has three goals: 1) To provide a comprehensive overview of the scientific work carried out in the Canton of the Grisons, 2) To stimulate information exchange between the scientists themselves as well as with industry, politics and the public, and 3) To award excellent work in each research area. In 2010, this meeting will fall into a time of important legislation towards a new law aimed at fostering academic research in the Canton. The meeting will provide a unique opportunity for law makers and politicians to inform themselves about the excellence, economic value and reputation of research in this area.

Who should attend?

All master students, doctoral candidates, and postdoctoral fellows working in an institution in the Canton of Grisons, or working on a topic related to the Canton of Grisons should submit an abstract. Their supervisors should be present to support discussions.

Personnel from universities or institutions interested in collaboration or the topics presented are welcome.

Companies looking for partners or collaborators should attend at least the special session dedicated to the interaction between industry and science.

The lay public is invited to update itself on the latest findings and their consequences.
